Things to See and Know

Sensory Bag

At the Guest Services desk, I can ask for a Sensory Bag to use during my visit. They hold items that can help me enjoy the center when I am feeling overwhelmed or excited! I can:


- Wear the headphones if it is too loud

Tram Rides to NASA Johnson Space Center



Plan for the Tram

If we want to take a tram ride, we should visit the Guest Services Desk to plan that activity.

Ticket Reservations

Some tickets require ticket reservations, while some are first come, first served.

Things to Know

- There may be a tram line I need to wait in patiently before liftoff!
- I can wear a jacket if it is cold or raining outside.
- The tram also has a ramp if I or someone in my family needs one.
- I will listen to the rules for riding the tram, like no standing while it is moving and no food while riding.

Tram Routes

THE TRAM WILL TAKE US TO FUN PLACES!

- **01** Rocket Park is where we will see a real Saturn 5 rocket! It is 363 feet tall, which is taller than 10 school buses put together!
- 02 The Astronaut Training Facility is where real astronauts train in mockups so that they are ready for their space missions.
- 03 The Historic Mission Control Center is where the NASA team sat when we first landed on the moon in 1969!

At the Kid's Play Space, I can touch and play with many things!

This spot might have a lot of kids, but I will wait my turn and learn a lot!

Mission to Mars

I can learn about how scientists are learning about the planet Mars at the Mission Mars exhibit!

Remember, no crumbs!




Live Shows

This part of the museum has really cool space artifacts.


This area is darker, so I can feel like I am in space!




FLOWN ARTIFACT

Apollo 17 Command Module

Apollo 17 was the last Apollo mission to the moon until the Artemis program.

This authentic Command Module completed the most lunar orbits at 75 full orbits! Lunar orbit means a journey around the moon!



TRAINING ARTIFACT

Lunar Roving Vehicle Trainer

This rover was used by real astronauts to train for their visit to the moon!

There is no steering wheel or brakes, but why? On the Moon, there is no air, so they one need one control to start, steer and stop.
